1) Trend of COVID-19 cases/positive COVID-19 tests

Percent positive has decreased over the past week (October 13th to October 20th) from 5.1 to 3%. Cases per million have decreased from 222.6 to 104.6. We had 97 cases in the past 7 days – another new record. I expect that we will soon be at over 250 cases since October 1. It took us from March to October to get to 350.

2) Hospitalizations due to COVID-19

Two at SIH in the past week. I was told yesterday that Sparrow Lansing was closed to transfers and was discussing the cancellation of elective procedures. I was also informed that Spectrum put a hold on elective procedures. I have learned that these decisions can change very rapidly at hospital systems. However, it underscores the point made in my update last week that hospitals in the region continue to see an increase in COVID cases and admissions. They are not in crisis mode yet but are beginning to feel the strain, and are preparing for larger surges. Here is a statement sent out yesterday by the Michigan Health and Hospital

3) Number of deaths resulting from COVID-19 in the past 14 days One

4) COVID-19 cases for each day for every one million individuals

5) Percentage of positive COVID-19 tests over a four-week period increased from 1.6 to 3% from September 22nd to October 20th

6) Health Care capacity strength

Nobody knows what this means because the legislature decided not to define it. There is a group from the State and LHDs working on a reasonable definition.

7) Testing, tracing, and containment infrastructure with regard to COVID-19

Sparrow is holding steady with regard to testing. Health Department capacity for contact tracing and case investigation is at its limit. Containment infrastructure is weak. We have no way to know if most people are truly complying with quarantine and isolation. This is a problem across the State.

At this point I (Mr. Bowen) am not recommending a switch to virtual only, but please be aware that could change at any time. Given the numbers in the community, a given school building is an outbreak away from me having to make that recommendation. For purposes of the matrix that I sent out, we are in Risk Category D as a County.
