Video description: *Coronavirus Is Our Future/Alanna Shaikh/TEDxSMU*; 16:46, published March 11, 2020

- 1. The speaker says we should not just listen to *everyone* that wants to talk about this virus. What credentials does the speaker have? What makes her qualified as a reliable source of information?
- 2. What does it mean to call COVID-19 virus "zoonotic"? Other zoonotic viruses exist, such as the bird flu, that we don't really worry much about. How is COVID-19 different from the bird flu?
- 3. Carefully listen to Alanna's explanation for why we are facing this new virus. What activities do humans engage in that have led to this virus being introduced to our society? There are two parts to her explanation. Respond with consideration for both parts.
- 4. The speaker says that more infectious diseases will erupt and future outbreaks are inevitable. We need to prepare for them. Alanna has some big recommendations for our societies regarding healthcare. What does she say we can do in order to better manage future outbreaks?
- 5. How would this outbreak have happened differently if we were "perfectly prepared"?
- 6. What can we do? What recommendations does Alanna have for us (about 14 min into the video)?
